In the event that we receive more applications than available sponsored tickets, we will utilise a competitive process in which all 200-word statements will be anonymously reviewed and scored by reviewers from the UK Centre for Animal Law and the Multispecies Collective. You will be contacted with an outcome and, if you are successful, with instructions on how to register for the conference by purchasing your free ticket which must be done by the **20th of May**.
